He trained as a kane (male) dancer under legendary Hilo Kumu (teacher) hula Johnny Lum Ho until the age of 13. Once he was discovered to have exceptional musical abilities he was pulled from the hula line and added as a permanent hālau musician. Kuana's photographic musical memory allowed the kumu to compose songs and have them recigted lated, as needed.
